Who may register?

Anyone who meets the educational admission requirements, and is in good standing with the College.

Teachers of religious education in schools or other institutional contexts, such as parishes and faith communities, will find it especially beneficial.

It is also useful to those who wish to explore Christian topics in relation to other educational disciplines.

How will it work?

TEE College offers its programmes through distance learning – students remain in their local context, engage with the study materials and assessment instruments, and submit the required work.

An online learning platform is the primary means for interacting with learning materials and submitting assessments.

Course content is downloaded and can be used in off-line mode, but internet connectivity is required for submitting work.

Printed copies of course materials can be made available at an additional fee.

What work is required?

Each 15-credit course requires 150 notional hours of work, which includes time for reading, reflection, any activities, and for preparing and submitting assessments.

Students will be required to submit two assignments for formal assessment and feedback, in addition to ongoing formative assessment on the learning platform. Courses may also require the completion of practical work.

What does it cost?

TEE College offers a discounted price when fees are paid on full at application, alternatively fees are paid with a deposit on application and the balance in four instalments by debit order.

Advanced Certificate in Religious Education

COMPULSORY COURSES - (Complete all four courses)

5RE01 - Revelation, Scripture & Tradition

This course explores the nature, structure and formation of the texts and canons of the Christian Scriptures, and develops basic skills of interpretation. It touches on issues such as inspiration, truth and inerrancy, and the relationship to tradition, reason and human experience. It broadens awareness of how different Christian communities understand these sacred texts and their use in personal and communal contexts.

5RE02 - Human Existence, God & Human Destiny

This course introduces the discipline of Christian theology through reflection on its nature, its sources and its methods. It provides an overview of the past two millennia creating opportunities for critical reflection on some key theological themes such as creation, the human person, sexuality and gender, suffering and human destiny in order to develop a heightened appreciation and sense of awe and wonder before the mystery of God, creation and humanity. This helps develop greater confidence in dealing with theological questions, and an ability to correlate these with the experience of those they teach.

5RE03 - World Religions & Interreligious Dialogue

This course challenges students to develop an appreciation of diversity, given the multicultural and multi-religious context of Religious Education in South Africa. In their practice, they will develop a dialogical approach to teaching and learning so that their learners are individually affirmed in their cultural and religious identity, while, in turn, come to appreciate the identities of others in their midst. Students will be equipped with a basic knowledge of the major religions found in South Africa and will be introduced to various forms of interreligious dialogue. Religions included in this module are African Tradition, Buddhism, Hinduism, Islam and Judaism.

5RE04 - Religious Education in Theory & Practice

This course explores the practice of Religious Education as a dimension of the school curriculum, and to other formal contexts, such as the school or faith community. Relevant policy and framework documents as well as the rights and responsibilities of schools (public and independent) with regard to religion will be explored.

A practical focus includes the teaching and learning process in Religious Education and how to manage it in the learning environment, including language used in religion, the correlation of faith with life, appropriate methodologies, and suitable resources. This will be done with a knowledge of and sensitivity to the learners' different contexts, ages and stages of spiritual, moral and religious development.

This qualification is accredited with the Council on Higher Education, is registered with the Department of Higher Education and Training, and has been recorded against the National Qualifications Framework by the South African Qualifications Authority.

The Advanced Certificate in Religious Education is a complete qualification. Graduates are able to continue with other TEEC programmes or continue studies at other institutions.

Progression: The general course combination rules are described above. During the programme roll-out students are limited to course 5RE01 in 2020, and to a maximum of 2 courses per semester in 2021 (a total of 4 courses for 2021).

Private study: From 2022 students are able to register for individual courses on an NDP basis (entrance requirements waived, courses can be attempted individually outside of the normal combination rules, but no graduation).
